ORDINATION CHARGE

MY FELLOW MINISTERS, the church has considered your call to ordained ministry and by prayer and the laying on of hands recognizes your calling in the Seventh-day Adventist Church. Your responsibility will be many and wide-ranging. You are to preach the gospel of love and forgiveness, and to make Christ the centre.

To young Timothy the apostle Paul gave divine counsel for ministry. He said,

- Preach the word of God. Be prepared, whether the time is favourable or not.
- Patiently correct, rebuke, and encourage your people with good teaching.
- For a time is coming when people will no longer listen to sound and wholesome teaching.
- They will follow their own desires and will look for teachers who will tell them whatever their itching. They will reject the truth and chase after myths. But you should keep a clear mind in every situation.
- Don't be afraid of suffering for the Lord. Work at telling others the Good News, and fully carry out the ministry God has given you (2 Tim. 4:2-5, NLT).

He also continued, in writing to the church at Corinth in 1 Corinthians 2:4-5 in the Contemporary English Version, "When I talked with you or preached, I didn't try to prove anything by sounding wise. I simply let God's Spirit show his power. That way you would have faith because of God's power and not because of human wisdom."



FELLOW MINISTERS, I charge you to direct your time, talents, and energy to your work you have been ordained to perform. There is no turning back. Let nothing divert your attention or influence you from the path you have chosen with God. Your conduct must be exemplary and your integrity unquestionable. Your words, personal appearance, and your actions must be in keeping with your calling as a minster for God.

Your ordination is a public recognition of your calling as an ordained minister.

You are authorized from today to perform the sacred rites reserved to an ordained minister. By your own submission to the laying on of hands and in recognition of your call, I now charge you with your sacred duties. Fully fulfill them so that upon the completion of your task you will hear the cheering words: "Well done, thou good and faithful servant: . . . enter thou into the joy of thy Lord."

From an early age, I felt a deep tenderness toward the Church.
