## RV PUMP-OUT SERVICE

Arrangements have been made with Little John's Service for a RV holding tank pump-out service for RV located on sites without sewer connections. The first pump-out will be free, with subsequent pump-outs costing \$21.00 each time. This service will be provided on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday mornings.
